The Lord’s Prayer Example (6:7-13)

“Our Father.” God is the believer’s Father, and is the way that Jesus addressed him in prayer.

“Hallowed be thy name.” “Hallowed” means holy; set apart;

sanctified. This phrase denotes a worshipful attitude or spirit. It is giving due honor and praise for who God is.

“Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done.” A yielding of our will and plans to the will of God; a willingness to submit to God.

“Give us this day our daily bread.” This is coming to God, and asking him to supply our needs, whether they are material or spiritual. This is day by day; not worrying about the needs of tomorrow (6:34).

“And forgive us our debts.” Even though God has truly forgiven us of our sins at salvation, God still desires that we continually confess our sins to him while in our earthly bodies: not to become saved again, but to remain right with God.

“And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.” Praying to God for deliverance in time of temptation and trial.

◀How to Walk With God

1. Read the Bible. “Give attendance to reading” (1 Timothy 4:13). The Bible does not specify how much of the word of God you must read. Nevertheless, reading is vital if you are going to move on to the following crucial step.

2. Meditate on the word of God. “Meditate upon these things” (1 Timothy 4:15). While Bible reading is important, thinking on the word of God is even more important; and is emphasized in the Scriptures. Consider how you could apply the word of God practically to your life, while applying your heart, not just your mind, to what you have read. “Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee” (Psalm 119:11).

3. Please God. “Give thyself wholly to them; that thy profiting may appear to all” (1 Timothy 4:15). [Compare Genesis 5:24 with Hebrews 11:5.] After meditating upon the word of God, seek to apply your heart to what you have read, and obey God in those areas of your life that he has spoken to you about. “Be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves” (James 2:22).

4. Talk to God throughout the day. “Pray without ceasing” (1 Thessalonians 5:17). “Continuing instant in prayer” (Romans 12:12).

“Praying always” (Ephesians 6:18). If you can have a set time for prayer, that would be of great value. However, what is more important than a prayer time is a prayer life. Strive to keep in contact with the Lord throughout the day. Give him your momentary and sudden requests; share your feelings; tell him your struggles at the moment. Practice the presence of God, and develop a real relationship with a real Person. Talk with the Lord as you would talk to your best friend in a personal and natural way. “God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble” (Psalms 46:1).

The Works of the Flesh (5:19-21)

Adultery: unfaithfulness in marriage. (Leviticus 20:10 and Deuteronomy 22:22)

Fornication: a general term that can be defined as any sexually related sin, usually committed outside of wedlock. (1 Thessalonians 4:3-5)

Uncleanness and Lasciviousness: these two works are closely related and include adultery and fornication, and also comprise homosexuality and other perversions. (2 Corinthians 12:21, Ephesians 4:19, Ephesians 5:3)

Idolatry: the worshiping of idols and images (Deuteronomy 4:15-19); stubbornness (1 Samuel 15:22-23). Covetousness is also considered as idolatry, since a person is placing something before God in importance (Colossians 3:5, Ephesians 5:5).

Witchcraft: defined Biblically as that which involves the use of magic, astrology, or devil worship (Deuteronomy 18:10-12, Leviticus 19:26). It also comprises self-worship and rebellion. (1 Samuel 15:22-23)

Hatred: extreme dislike for someone. (Leviticus 19:17-18)

Variance: to be set against someone, by pride or anger.

Emulations: to excel and contend against another for personal and selfish interests.

Wrath: violent anger or indignation.

Strife: contention and opposition.

Seditions: rebellion against government and authority. (Ezra 4:15)

Heresies: false doctrines and corrupt teachings.

Envyings: rivalry; malice; displeasure at the success of another.

Murders: the unjust killing of someone; also, the hating of one's brother. (Matthew 5:21-22, 1 John 3:15)

Drunkenness and Revellings: includes every aspect of the party life: drinking, smoking, drugs (1 Peter 4:1-4; 2 Timothy 3:1-2, 4); also, it can be simply a life of living for self and pleasure, one moment to the next, while neglecting the will of God (Ecclesiastes 10:17, Matthew 24:37-38, Isaiah 22:13, Ezekiel 16:49, Luke 12:19).

The Fruit of the Spirit (5:22-23)

Love: the laying down of one's self for another, without expecting anything in return. (John 15:13)

Joy: delight or gladness in the Lord. (Nehemiah 8:10, Philipians 4:4)

Peace: a state of quiet or delightful rest. (Romans 14:19, 15:13, Philipians 4:7)

Longsuffering: the act of suffering long with someone; forbearance and patience towards the faults and flaws of others. (Colossians 1:11, 2 Peter 3:9)

Gentleness: tenderness; not striving against others. (2 Timothy 2:24)

Goodness: the act of doing good for others. (Ephesians 5:9, Acts 10:38)

Faith: a trust in God and his Word. (Hebrews 11:1, 6)

Meekness: humbleness of mind; considering one's self when others have been tempted. (Galatians 6:1)

Temperance: control of one's self through the Spirit of God. (1 Corinthians 9:25-27)

4. Talk to God throughout the day. “Pray without ceasing” (1 Thessalonians 5:17). “Continuing instant in prayer” (Romans 12:12). “Praying always” (Ephesians 6:18). If you can have a set time for prayer, that would be of great value. However, what is more important than a prayer time is a prayer life. Strive to keep in contact with the Lord throughout the day. Give him your momentary and sudden requests; share your feelings; tell him your struggles at the moment. Practice the presence of God, and develop a real relationship with a real Person. Talk with the Lord as you would talk to your best friend in a personal and natural way. “God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble” (Psalms 46:1).

Temperance: control of one's self through the Spirit of God; self-control; moderation. The Bible relates temperance to the "mastery" of the Christian life by way of these words: "to keep under [the] body and bring it in subjection" (1 Corinthians 9:25-27).

Patience: enduring the will of God with a submissive and contented attitude; persistence; a steady waiting on God's promise. "For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise" (Hebrews 10:36).

Godliness: good works; sincere piety; love and service to God from the heart. Being somewhat akin to virtue, the Christian is reminded to continue on in more good works and devotion, but out of a love for God and in accordance to the word of God, casting off self-made religious rules and the pride of life. (1 Timothy 2:10, 6:11)

Brotherly Kindness: good will toward others; act of love toward man. "The kindness and love of God our Saviour toward man appeared" (Titus 3:4). "Good will toward men" (Luke 2:14).

Charity: refined love and kindness, chiefly toward the brethren. "And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of perfectness" (Colossians 3:14). "Charity suffereth long, and is kind" (1 Corinthians 13:4).

How to Walk With God

1. Read the Bible. “Give attendance to reading” (1 Timothy 4:13). The Bible does not specify how much of the word of God you must read. Nevertheless, reading is vital if you are going to move on to the following crucial step.

2. Meditate on the word of God. “Meditate upon these things” (1 Timothy 4:15). While Bible reading is important, thinking on the word of God is even more important; and is emphasized in the Scriptures. Consider how you could apply the word of God practically to your life, while applying your heart, not just your mind, to what you have read. “Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee” (Psalm 119:11).

3. Please God. “Give thyself wholly to them; that thy profiting may appear to all” (1 Timothy 4:15). [Compare Genesis 5:24 with Hebrews 11:5.] After meditating upon the word of God, seek to apply your heart to what you have read, and obey God in those areas of your life that he has spoken to you about. “Be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves” (James 2:22).

4. Talk to God throughout the day. “Pray without ceasing” (1 Thessalonians 5:17). “Continuing instant in prayer” (Romans 12:12). “Praying always” (Ephesians 6:18). If you can have a set time for prayer, that would be of great value. However, what is more important than a prayer time is a prayer life. Strive to keep in contact with the Lord throughout the day. Give him your momentary and sudden requests; share your feelings; tell him your struggles at the moment. Practice the presence of God, and develop a real relationship with a real Person. Talk with the Lord as you would talk to your best friend in a personal and natural way. “God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble” (Psalms 46:1).
