

**Everyone says you must walk the straight and narrow, but what does that mean?**

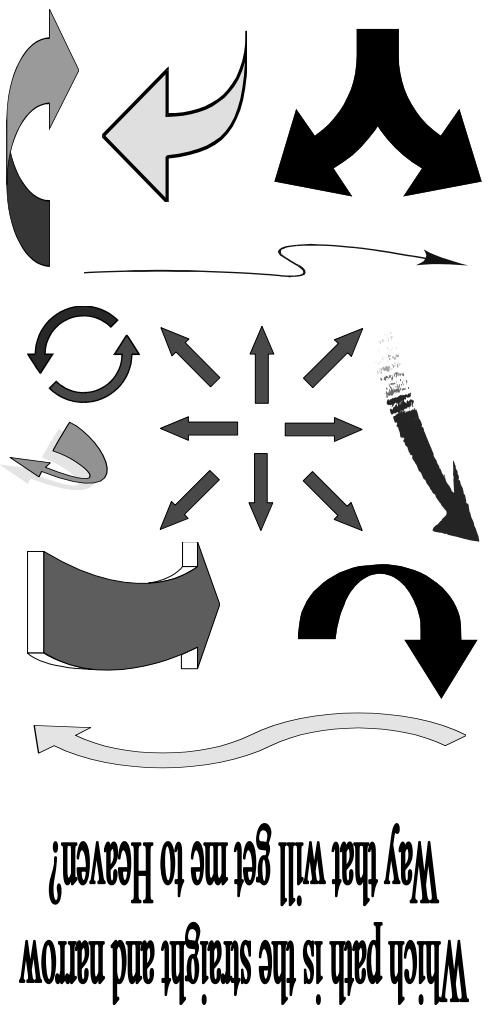
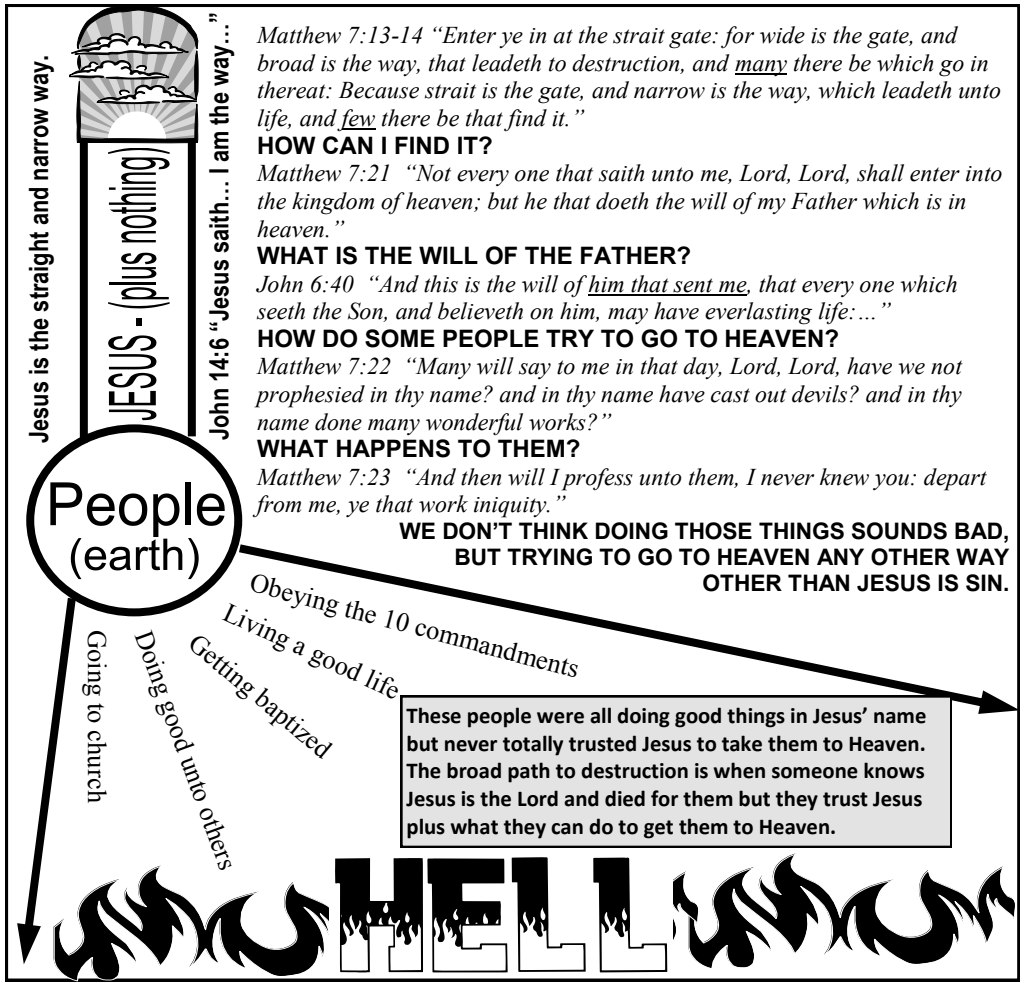
Even though we hear people talk all the time about walking the straight and narrow to get to Heaven, I have never seen anyone explain it so that it makes sense from the Bible.

- ☛ Does it mean that we have to live really good to go to Heaven?
- ☛ Does it mean we must stay on the path that Jesus walked and do what He did?
- ☛ Does it mean making sure we don't do anything wrong and slip off the path?
- ☛ Does it mean if we slip off, we can't get back on, or what do we have to do to get back on if we did get off that path?
- ☛ How close do I have to stay on the path?
- ☛ Where is the path, and how do I know if I am walking on it?

If you look at these questions, all of them are dealing with doing good works, but the Bible teaches that we are not saved by works.

Many questions like these come up when you don't look at all the verses around the one that says to "walk the straight and narrow." You must read it in context.

**Now What?**

If you just asked Jesus to save you, then, according to the Bible you are on your way to Heaven. It is not anything you did good that takes you to Heaven. It is trusting what Jesus did on the cross that takes you to Heaven.

The first thing Jesus wants you to do now that you are on your way to Heaven is to go to church. Church does not save you, but it does help you to grow in the Christian life and be what God now saved you to be. Just like a person who plays football has a coach and a playing field, a Christian has a coach (pastor), and a playing field (church). A coach and a football field don't make him a football player, they just make him a better football player. Going to church doesn't make a person a Christian, but it helps a Christian to be a better Christian. Just like you would ask the coach a question about the Bible or the Christian life.

Many people will say they already have a church that they attend. It just makes sense to me to go to the church where someone cares enough to give you this tract to try to help you make sure you are on your way to Heaven. At least give it a try and visit one time.
